REFLECTION:

Hyperkeratosis of the lower limb is a common skin condition that typically affects patients with lymphoedema and chronic venous insufficiency. Hyperkeratosis of the lower limb is an abnormal thickening of the outer layer of the skin (the stratum corneum) localised to the lower leg and foot. Patients are often embarrassed by the physical appearance of their skin, the flaking of the hyperkeratotic scales and the unpleasant odour caused by bacterial or fungal colonisation.
