REFLECTION:

Coughing is an essential reflex which clears excess secretions and foreign matter from the airway. The essential components include deep inspiration, closure of the glottis and forceful expiration. Cough strength can be reduced in patients with inspiratory and expiratory muscle weakness, leading to low lung volumes and difficulty clearing secretions. Mechanical insufflation-exsufflation (in-exsufflation) via a Cough Assist Machine can assist in the removal of pulmonary secretions without the need for more invasive techniques such as open (guedel or nasopharyngeal) airway suctioning.
